Collective Voice- Your Voice, Your Data

The steering committee serves as the core partnership entity working together to review needs and data collected by the Listening Way Leaders within each Community. The data serves as the guideline for addressing and finding solutions to alleviating social ills and problems experienced by individuals within each community, and is uniquely representative of that community.

Over the past quarter, we have established steering committees in several villages and hope to establish committees in all villages by year end. The Listening Way Leaders have been quite effective this quarter with over 200% increase in listening activity. We have reports available upon request for all of your community meetings to highlight the issues noticed in the villages in a summary report. We now have enough data for village specific data for 8 of the 10 villages supported by IAM. Summary and village reports can be requested of your village listening way leader.





Celebrations!!!

The high expense of internet on St. Lawrence Island has restricted IAM's work, but all of that is about to change. In October, IAM entered into an agreement with the Presbytery of Yukon to share the cost of internet through the Presbyterian Churches of Gambell and Savoonga. The Gambell Presbyterian Church leadership has already approved the plan, and work is beginning to get internet installed. The Savoonga church will likely be ready to move forward soon.

Elijah House Training
